

HEROES IN SERVICE - HEROES IN BUSINESS - HEROES IN LIFE



Mr. Dan Akerson Managing Partner, The Carlyle Group

Our guest speaker is Navy Veteran Mr. Dan Akerson, Vice Chairman of The Carlyle Group of Washington DC and former Chairman and CEO of General Motors. A Distinguished Graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy, he has led some of America's top corporations, including

GM, MCI, General Instruments, Nextel, and XO Communications. While at The Carlyle Group, he ran the Company's largest private equity fund. Following the economic challenges the nation faced in 2009, he led General Motors in the turnaround that resulted in GM earning record profits and restoring the U.S. automobile industry to global prominence. The son of a Navy WWII Veteran, his roots are in military service and private sector entrepreneurship. A business icon and mentor, a Veteran who has supported our military his entire life, and a strong and committed family man, he is a hero in service, hero in business, and hero in life, and a fitting keynote speaker for the 2015 RBA Constellation Awards Gala.

Remarks by Rear Admiral Anthony Watson, USN, Retired:

'Dan is one of the icons of American business. As one of the members of the leadership team building MCI, he was a key figure responsible for the revolution of the telecomm industry that saw Ma Bell transition into baby bells. He led Nextel into the push-to-talk mobile phone industry. He quintupled the revenues of General Instruments, which at the time made cable set top boxes; eventually bought out by Motorola. He became a Managing Partner of The Carlyle Group. According to a 2014 ranking called the PEI 300 based on capital raised over the last five years, Carlyle was ranked #1 as the largest private equity firm in the world. He was appointed by President Obama to be a member of the GM board He was Chairman and CEO of GM from 2010 to 2013. He sits on the boards of Lockheed Martin and American Express and is currently the Vice Chairman of The Carlyle Group. He is a Navy Veteran, U.S. Naval Academy Class of 1970, where he is a Distinguished Graduate. He also received the 2013 Black Engineer of the Year (BEYA) President's Award for the lifetime work he has done in promoting diversity in corporate America.

He is a classmate, good friend, and the real deal."
